## Class History

History must have a beginning. For the class of 155 it began September 3, 1943. We were thirty-nine very small and very frightened children. On this day our formal education began. Our teacher was Mrs. Rapp. A, B, C, and 1, 2, 3, were to become very familiar sights to us.

The next fall we entered the second grade. For the next nine months we studied under Mrs. Meredith. I think we shall always remember the excitement of "Reading Parties".

Our third year under the direction of Miss Seiders (Mrs. Frances) and later Mrs. Weaver, was to be memorable for the fact that this was the year we began our multiplication tables. This year we were to experience one of our first real tragedies with the passing of our classmate, Max Stettler.

Our fourth year brings memories of, "The Bears of Blue River" with Mrs. Gants as our teacher. This year also brought us Tom Koble who was later to become one of our outstanding members.

Those members who were weak in division will always remember our fifth year under Mrs. Morris. This year we began the nightmare called "long division'". Who of our forty-nine members could ever forget this ordeal?

On September 3, 1948, we metour firstmale teacher, Mr. George. Not one of us will ever be able to forget the day he sat in the bubble gum.

September 2, 1949, was truly a great day. This was the first day of school at the high school building. We had all looked forward to this for six years. There were forty-seven of us and each of us was to discover that what we had learned in the past was only a fraction of what we still had to learn.

Our eighth year was much the same as our seventh. During the summer another of our classmates, Glen Stahly, had passed away.

August 31, 1951, marked our first day as high school students. There were forty-four of us this year and each was instructed to collecta box of bugs. This seemed rather appalling to some, butwe soon conquered our squemish stomachs and went about our business.

Our sophomore year was to see a great drop in enrollment. We went from forty-four members to thirty-six. Did you know that the shortest distance between two points is a straight line?

Our Junior year we gained three members. By now we had all begun to worry if we had the correct number of credits; and what of those majors and minors.

On August 27, 1954, we entered Syracuse High as Seniors. During the course of the year we lost Carol Sue Carpenter and Dennis Firestone. This left us with thirty-one members.

When our class began in 1943, we had thirty-nine members. Of these fourteen completed all twelve years at Syracuse. These students were: Jane Kroh, Donna Michael, Norma Mock, Lenora Reagan, Darlene Rogers, Connie Sudlow, Freda Vorhis, Marlene Wilkinson, Janet Kitson, Clifford Byrd, Arthur Coy, Jerry Grady, Stover Hire and Lee Oyler.

On May 18, 1955, the Senior Class of ' 55 received their diplomas. This was a day that will long be remembered.
