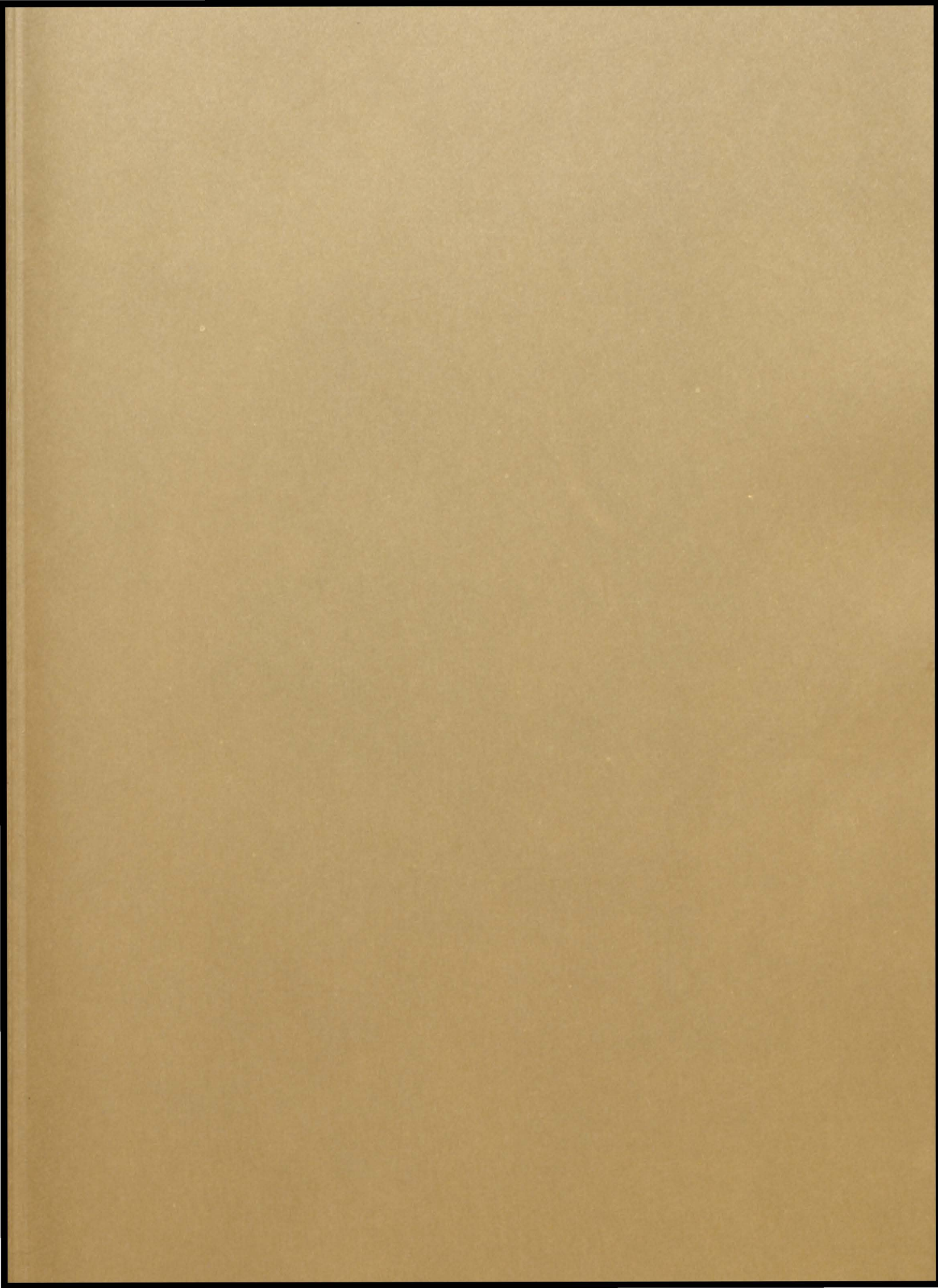

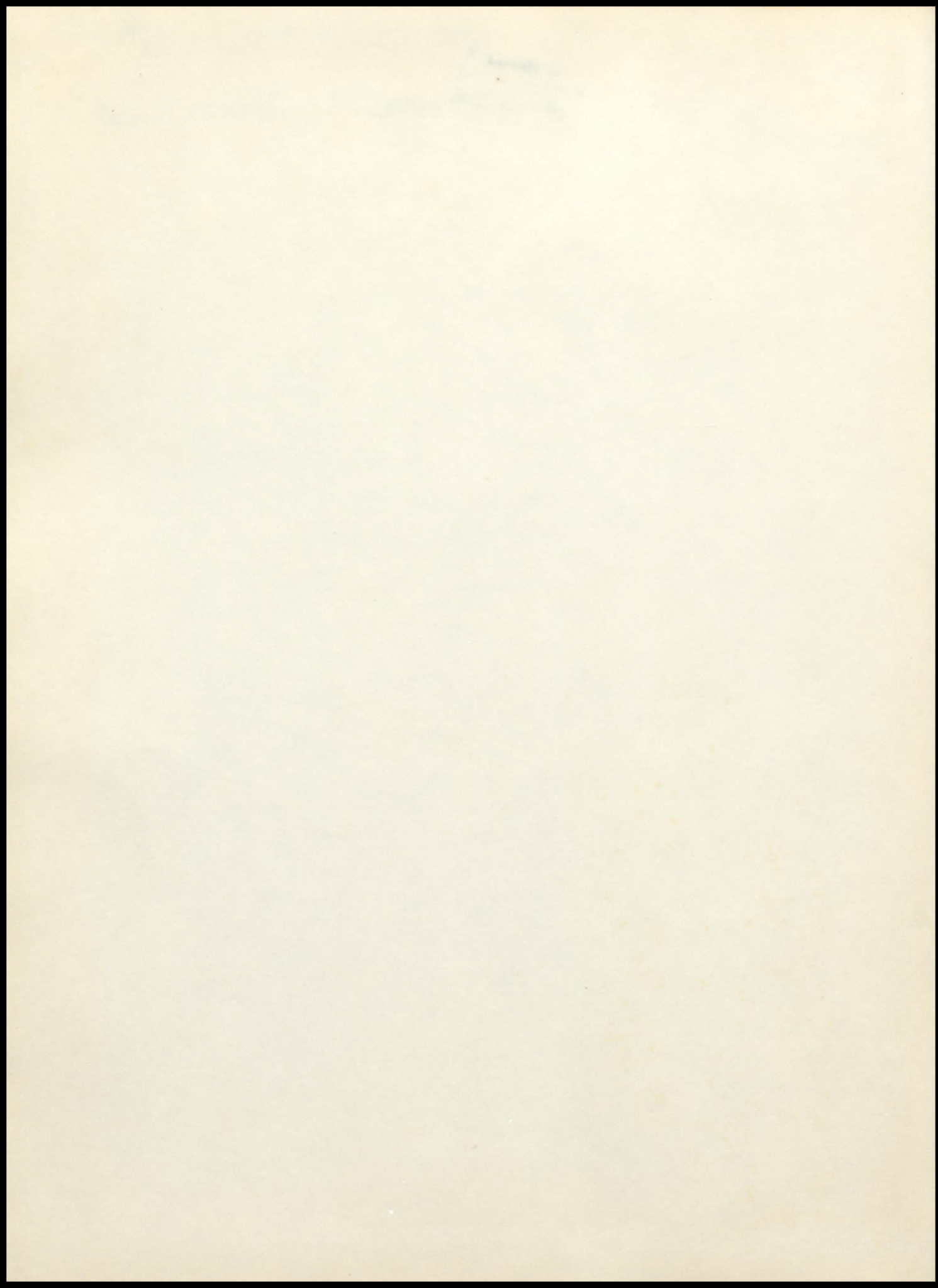

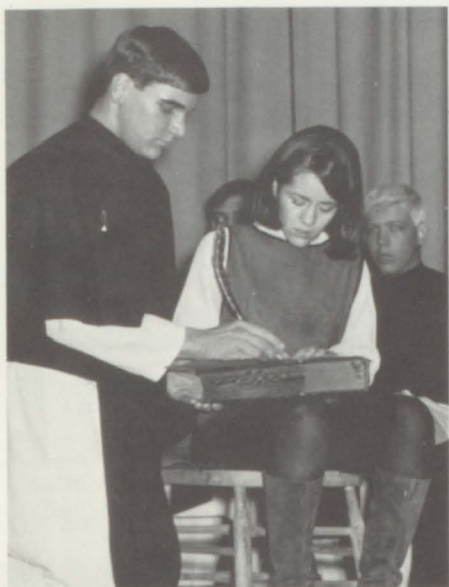


## *"We're from Syracuse High School; No One Could Be Prouder"*

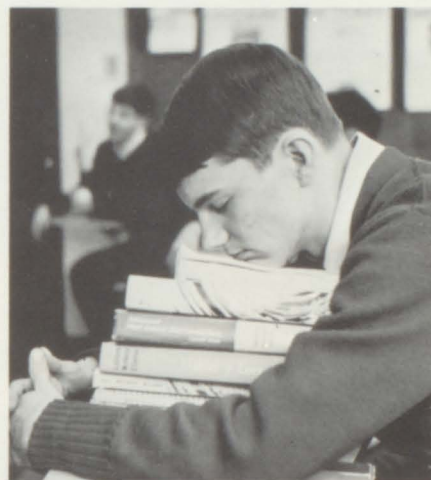

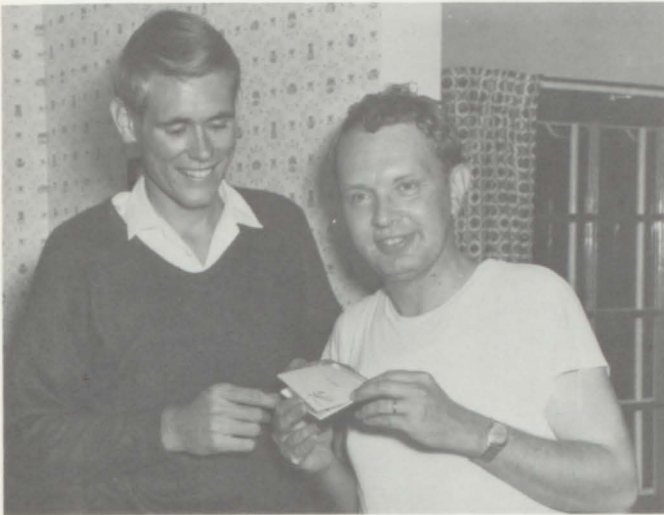

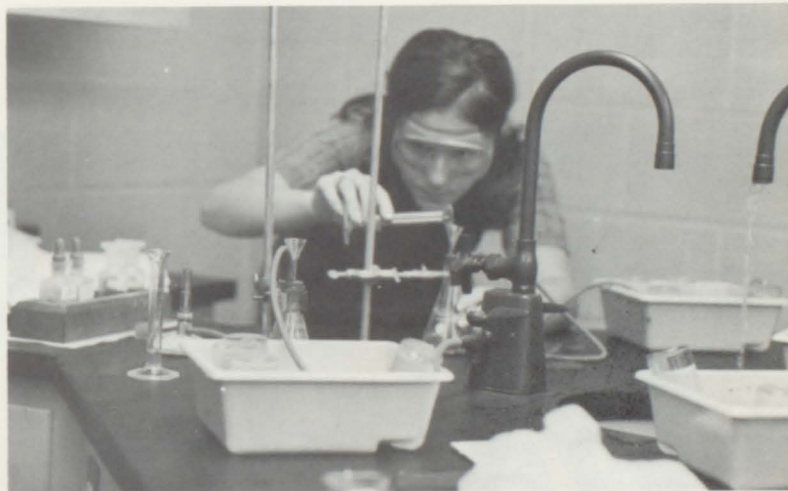

Thanks to the student body, faculty and fans this year was the best season a Syracuse team has had in a long time.





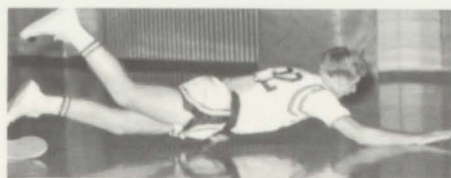
